



Considerations when Selecting Healthcare Providers

When seeking care for your health, please keep the following in mind:

- Credentials and License of the Healthcare Provider. Make sure the practitioner you are seeing
 has the appropriate credentials and license in the state you are seeing him/her. As a reminder,
 NFL Therapeutic Use Exemption Applications will only be considered when you are under the
 care of a licensed MD/DO physician.
- Prohibited Substances List for the NFL Policy on Performance-Enhancing Substances. Bring the
 list with you to your appointment and make sure the provider reviews the list prior to
 prescribing medication. The Prohibited Substances List for the NFL Policy on PerformanceEnhancing Substances is available to you on the NFL Drug Policies Contact Information website
 (https://pesnfl.com/cmservices/#/login) under Policy Resources.

- 4. TUE applications must be approved *prior* to starting on any medication. Do not take medication that contains a prohibited substance until you receive approval from Dr. Lombardo.
